

Curriculum Maps

By the time you are reading this, we will have updated the Curriculum area of our Nicholas Chamberlaine website to include detailed information about the content to be covered by each subject, for each year, over the Spring Term ahead.

In addition, we have updated the **Academic Engagement** link sheets for exam years (GCSE Y10 and Y11, A-Level Y12 and Y13). Each of these documents has been written by our subject experts and shares links to a range of content to support informed, independent learning. These links include:

- Exam **specifications** (supporting students to identify the content they should cover),
- Exam **past papers** (supporting students on how they will be formally assessed),
- Exam **mark schemes** (supporting students to self-assess, identifying strengths and areas for development through revision),
- Subject-specific **exam revision resources** (websites and apps),
- Links to **wider reading** to broaden overall understanding and horizons,
- Discipline-specific **enrichment** related to the subject.

Year 7 - Overcoming the Monster

In September, Year 7 embarked on their literary journey at Nicholas Chamberlaine School and have enjoyed studying "A Monster Calls". Through the novel, they explored themes of loss and growing up. They have developed their skills in writing analytical paragraphs. Year 7 have made a fantastic start to their time in KS3. We look forward to seeing how they flourish throughout the year.

Year 8 - Expectations of gender

Students have studied "Noughts & Crosses" and have approached difficult themes with a level of maturity beyond their years. Within the unit, they have explored how a playwright uses language/form and structure to create meaning and engage an audience.

We are excited about the upcoming trip to see 'Noughts and crosses' with some students from Year 8 at the Belgrade theatre. This will be a wonderful opportunity for our students to see the play they have been reading come to life in front of their eyes.

Year 9 - Prejudice and Discrimination

Year 9 started this year by being immersed in America in the 1930s. They have studied the novel "Of Mice and Men" and have applied their contextual knowledge of America at this time.

Alongside this, they have also practised their application of persuasive language to try to change the society in which we live. These skills will prepare them well as they enter their KS4 years.

Year 10 - AQA Language Paper 1 and Literature Paper 1

Students have made a positive start to their GCSEs. They have read one of their set texts and have had the opportunity to use their creative side to produce narratives. Students have already demonstrated that they have the potential to succeed.

The English department were very enthusiastic about taking some students from Year 10 to the RSC to watch "A Christmas Carol".
