House Competitions


This term our Performing Arts house competition will be based on our very much anticipated *Musical Matilda*.

Working for Marcus



Thanks to funding from Warwickshire County Council, all students in Year 8, 9 and 10 have been able to participate in a production by Birmingham-based theatre company, *Loudmouth*. The focus of the production looked a two areas that young people need to be aware of: child exploitation and County Lines.

Working for Marcus shows how young people can find themselves exploited by adults and provides practical advice hon ow students can keep themselves safe.

Following the production, all students took part in a workshop that reinforced the messages that they were given, including where to seek help for either themselves or someone that they may know.

Future Grads

Over the years, Nicholas Chamberlaine School has built strong partnerships with local universities.

This year the school was fortunate to be invited to take part in the *Future Grads programme; a* scheme where students are mentored with a view to them applying for university following Year 13.



This week we were delighted to receive an invitation to take every Year 12 student to Coventry University to take part in a student finance and budgeting day.

The trip enabled students to gain an insight into life at university through a campus tour. In addition, they found out how to budget effectively. The trip was a great success with students commenting that, "I thought the trip was very informative and I enjoyed seeing all the different facilities at the university. I learned a lot about budgeting and the opportunities at the university in general".

Over the year, students from Year 7 upward will be able to take part in similar opportunities and we are grateful for the support that the University of Coventry has provided in this regard.

Apprenticeships and other opportunities



The beginning of February will see the annual National Apprenticeship Week taking place. This is an opportunity for students to find out more about apprenticeships in a wide range of areas.

Nicholas Chamberlaine School will of course be taking part in this and more details will follow.



Warwickshire Inclusion Charter



We have worked closely with Warwickshire Local authority and their partners to develop the groundbreaking Warwickshire Inclusion Charter, which has been recognised at a national level including by the Chartered College of Teaching.

This charter reinforces the pledge to inclusion and the county's commitment to providing an inclusive education for all children and young people.

The Inclusion Charter has been created to set out a shared vision for schools across the county using the four cornerstones of:

- 1. 'Welcome and Care', understanding that every child is an individual;
- 2. 'Value and include' remembering that inclusion is everyone's responsibility;
- 3. 'Communicate'
- 4. 'Work in Partnership', working together to recognise need and support families on their journey.

This will support schools and families to consider and develop how they can work together to improve the experience of all children and staff in schools and demonstrate to others how they are doing this.


Early Help and Targeted Support
