



Termly Curriculum Overview

Year 4 Summer 1 - 2022



English

Class Book: The Worst Witch by Jill Murphy

- Our English work this half term will be linked to our topic.
- We will be developing skills in writing diaries and non-chronological reports.
- Our Grammar work will focus on using fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases and what determiners are.
- In Spelling we will be learning words that have suffixes and words from a root family.
- We will be continuing to work on spelling homophones.

Physical Literacy

- Swimming
- Athletics: The children will practise a range of athletics activities, in preparation for Sports Day.
- Basketball:

The children will learn how to dribble and pass the ball using a range of different techniques. Defensively, they will develop their skills of marking. Offensively, they will learn how to get free from a defender, how to shield the ball and the skill of pivoting. They will also learn some of the rules of the game and to play developed skills in practise.

Music

- To sing in tune in an ensemble
- To understand and recognise what a motif in music is.

Topic

- Our History learning will focus on the Norman conquest and everyday life in Norman times. We will learn about the Domesday Book and the hierarchy of life in a Norman castle.
- In Geography we will use OS maps to locate places using grid references.
- Our Art and Design work will take inspiration from the Bayeux Tapestry and using cold water paste techniques to make a book cover.

Science

 In Science we will be learning about solids, liquids and gases and changing states.

Mathematics

Number

- Compare and order decimals.
- Recognise 1/2 and 1/4 as decimals.

Measurement

- Solve problems using money.
- Convert between analogue and digital time.

We will also continue to focus on knowing times table facts up to 12 x 12.
